



JUSTIN D. ROBERTS

Award winning Director & former Army Captain

Former U.S. Army Chaplain, Captain Justin D Roberts wrote, filmed, and directed the documentary, *No Greater Love*. In 2009 he was chaplain over one of the most suicidal battalions in the military and developed a care program that helped soldiers to connect and find hope.

Justin left the military in March 2015 with the goal to use *No Greater Love* to launch a veteran support campaign to help our nation's warriors reconnect with their local communities. The film has won eleven awards across the country, screened before the White House and Congress, and Justin was the recipient of the Santini Patriot Spirit Award and Best Military Filmmaker from the G.I. Film Festival.

Justin is a graduate from Dallas Theological Seminary and has a Masters in Media Arts and Communication and a Masters in Biblical Studies.

CURRENT PROJECTS

Justin founded Echo Bravo Productions in 2018 with the goal of producing documentaries about military, veterans, and first-responders. They have just completed production on *The Baja Run*, which is documentary about a group of combat vets competing in the most dangerous off-road race in the world: the Baja 1000. He is also developing a documentary about Army chaplains called *Shepherd of Lions* with the Department of Defense and is in development on a documentary about the veteran band called Three Beards. He also has a photography book set to release this summer.
