

Terrilyn Miller brings people together for connection, healing and purpose. Terrilyn believes we are meant to be world changers, so it is without surprise that she delights in connecting leaders and stakeholders with common interests, multiplying impact through collaboration, and concentrating focus on shared goals that help others. In 2016, Terrilyn was invited to serve at the Governor's Office of Youth, Faith and Family (GOYFF) as the Director of Faith and Community Initiatives. In addition to other responsibilities, Terrilyn developed issue area briefs for Arizona's first lady and executive members of GOYFF on Adverse Childhood Experience and Trauma Informed Care which included connections to faith and community leaders expert in these areas. Terrilyn's work was foundational to GOYFF leading the Arizona initiative to become a trauma informed state in 2018. Through this same lens, GOYFF implements programs and initiatives with faith and community stakeholders related to substance abuse prevention, human trafficking, sexual and domestic violence, juvenile justice, and child wellbeing.

Before serving at the Governor's Office, Terrilyn fostered transformative care to people in need as the Director of CityServe Arizona through faith, business, nonprofit and government participation. During HopeFest Phoenix, CityServe's direct-services annual event, vulnerable families received free services, including medical and dental care, and were connected to resources facilitating long-term solutions, independence and stability. Each spring from 2012 through 2016, more than 100 service providers and 1,500 volunteers served 20,000 "guests" through the combined community effort at Chase Field Stadium in a fun, friendly and welcoming environment.

Terrilyn graduated from Arizona Christian University in 2011 with a degree in Business Administration and in 2015 received her Masters degree in Biblical Counseling from Victorious Christian Life Institute. She also is a Trauma Institute International Certified Clinical Trauma Specialist. A fourth generation Arizonan, Terrilyn grew up in Phoenix. She and her husband spent many years as entrepreneurs before she entered the nonprofit sector in 2011. They raised five sons and a daughter, and are enjoying a growing number of grandchildren.
