Paul's/Mentor's Self Talk #1:

 "My desire to develop leaders with the intention of transitioning power and authority to them must be genuine. I must own it!" It's from the inside out.

Timothy's/Learner's Self Talk:

 "The willingness of a leader or leaders to invest in learners like me is rare. I won't take it for granted and I will be grateful."

Paul's/Mentor's Self Talk #2:

• "I must understand leaders come in all shapes and sizes. There's no perfect, supercalifragilistic expialidocious leadership style and personality.

Timothy's/Learner's Self Talk:

• "There is not a single successful leadership style so I can be myself. I will be myself because everybody else is taken." Elisha's job was to be Elisha, not Elijah.

Paul's/Mentor's Self Talk #3:

• "I will need a high pain threshold if I am going to work with young leaders. Young leaders can be exhausting."

Timothy's/Learner's Self Talk:

• "I will make a lot of mistakes. I will say and do stupid things. So I will be humble and remain teachable."

Paul's/Mentor's Self Talk #4:

• "I will be pushed beyond my comfort zone in many areas of my life when I develop Timothy's. It may be disruptive to my current ministry and schedule."

Timothy's/Learner's Self Talk:

• "Likely, I will be in a hurry to lead, so I'll be patient. I will give time, time. I'll be right on time in the nick of time. I will trust in the process of maturity."

Paul's/Mentor's Self Talk #5:

"I will need to understand that by definition these future leaders aren't fully developed."

Timothy's/Learner's Self Talk:

"I'm not a finished product, so I will listen and be open.

Paul's/Mentor's Self Talk #6:

• "I must assign them meaningful, important and significant tasks. I will give them more to do than clean toilets."

Timothy's/Learner's Self Talk:

• "The work given to me to do will be important, so I'll take it seriously. I'll earn the right to lead."

Paul's/Mentor's Self Talk #7:

• "I should be their guard wall, not the wall. I will be a blessing, not a barrier. I will need to lift them out, then lift them up."

Timothy's/Learner's Self Talk:

"My mentor is there to protect me from myself, so I'll be coachable and teachable."

Paul's/Mentor's Self Talk #8:

• "I need to be their cheerleader. I will encourage them."

Timothy's/Learner's Self Talk:

"I will need an advocate. I will need encouragement, so I will be faithful."

• "I am currently designing and planning the organization they will inherit. I'll give them a place at the table that is relevant to them and their generation."

• "I'm being given a unique opportunity, so I'll be respectful when I get a place at the table."

"I recognize that I will lose good men, maybe even the best men, if I don't do this."

• "I will be in a better environment to learn and grow if I hang in there, so I'll be loyal. Then I won't be be a homeless child with an orphan spirit.
